Rationale:

The ACT Writing section asks you to look at a passage of information and then three perspectives about the topic in that passage. From this, you are then asked to break it down to respond to what you have read and understood.

Read the ACT Writing Prompt Below:

Directions: Read the opening passage, which will give you basic information about your topic. Once finished, look at the three perspectives about this topic and consider these ideas. Finally, look at the "Essay Task" at the bottom to respond to this topic. Your final response essay should be 3-5 paragraphs in length.

Many of the goods and services we depend on daily are now supplied by intelligent, automated machines rather than human beings. - → <u>Perspective 2</u>--Machines are good at low-skill, repetitive jobs, and at high-speed, extremely precise jobs. In both cases they work better than humans. This efficiency leads to a more prosperous and progressive world for everyone.
- → <u>Perspective 3</u>--Intelligent machines challenge our long-standing ideas about what humans are or can be. This is good because it pushes both humans and machines toward new, unimagined possibilities.
